Ann is a native Texan born in Corpus Christi and raised in a small, rural, railroad town, Teague, Texas. She attended Baylor University and completed her degree in Education at the University of Houston. She taught public school and private kindergarten before beginning the work of administering religious education in a succession of Baptist Churches across the nation.

In 1993, she became a volunteer in the Washington, D.C. office of Concerned Women for America, convincing U.S. Senators and U.S. Congressmen to pass conservative Christian values in public policy. Upon her return to Texas she was selected to become a leader in the organization and in 2006 became the State Director. She served several years on their national board of trustees.

During her tenure with CWA, Texas passed the Constitutional Amendment restricting marriage in Texas to be one man and one woman, the Sonogram Bill in 2011, as well as HB 2, the Omnibus Life Bill in 2013, and the Pastor Protection Act in 2015. She currently serves as the Public Policy Director for the Center for The Preservation of American Ideals and is on the Board of Directors. During the 2017 session she worked to help pass the Anti-Dismemberment Abortion bill, and the Church Protection Act, which allows churches to engage volunteers to act as security for their meetings; as well as HB 45 which requires judge's rulings to adhere only to American and Texas law. In addition, she serves on the Board of Trustees for Criswell College and the Ethics and Religious Liberty Ministry Team of First Baptist Church, Dallas.

She continues to serve on the Board of Rockwall County Republican Women's Club as Vice President of Legislation as she has for several terms in the past and has been selected to represent Republican voters at the County and State Conventions for several election cycles. She has also been active in the campaigns of candidates for public office across the state and nation.

She has been married for fifty-nine years to Hays, who served as an attorney for the Federal Aviation Agency in assignments in Fort Worth, Houston, Seattle, Chicago and Washington, D.C. before retiring to Rockwall in 1993 and entering private practice in Dallas. They have two daughters, six grandchildren and three great grandsons.

Editor's Note: In 2015, Ann was the recipient of the Rockwall County Republican Women's "Woman of Influence Award". Her accomplishments as Board Member of CWA and RCRW are so vast, it would take the entire Newsletter to describe. She has never been too busy to educate RCRW on legislation. Thank you, Ann, for your invaluable service to our club.


